Message from Mr.B

What a super term packed full of reasons to be cheerful! The performances from the children in their Nativity and Concerts were amazing and got us all in the festive mood. The children have been amazing all term and I am really proud of them. I would like to take this opportunity to welcome our 2 new parent Governors, Emma Bennett and Kimberley Bennett to the board. Thank you to all who voted and took part in the election process. I am really looking forward to working with them. Thanks to all the other Governors supporting the school over the past year; their support and guidance is extremely important in our continued success. Congratulations to Mrs Dobbin, Mr Waugh and Miss Kempton who all passed their National qualifications for senior leadership (NPQSL) last week and best wishes to Mrs Pietrzak who commenced her National Professional Qualification for Headship (NPQH). Our commitment to our own adult learning ensures we keep up to date with the latest research and methodologies to continue to improve our teaching.

Our school Improvement work has focused on deepening our understanding of the new inspection framework and its implications for school. The new style OFSTED report card is far more comprehensive and requires a set of judgements across 7 aspects of the school; Inclusion, curriculum and teaching, achievement, attendance and behaviour, personal development and wellbeing, early years and leadership and governance. Although there are no single word judgements on a school the process is extremely robust and will now be carried out by 2 inspectors over 2 days. We are approximately 18 months away from our next inspection but I consider we would meet the expected standard requirements already. After half term we will be devoting significant time developing our new Oracy project based on Stockport speaks; this is an exciting project that will give the children confidence in a range on speaking contexts and enable them to then improve their writing skills.

Our building work this half term has been as a response to the fire safety audit; doors have been resealed, windows fixed and a number of taps and minor plumbing works have been carried out. As soon as the weather permits we will replace the facia boards above the lower junior entrance and all the facia boards will then be repainted. The wild flower meadows have been prepared ready for the Spring.

I would like to thank my colleagues for all their hard work and dedication this term and throughout the year; they are an incredibly talented team and we are really lucky. Have a wonderful Christmas and thank you for your support this year.
