Message from Mr.B

We have had a truly fantastic year and I am so proud of all our childrens' achievements; they have worked incredibly hard. As you will read, they have had many opportunities to perform and show case their talents. From class assemblies, harvest festival, singing and superb Nativities they have shown the confidence, enthusiasm and positivity at all ages in school.

Through our OFSTED in February and our recent "one voice" Local Authority moderation visit Torkington has been judged as a strong, Good school; I am immensely grateful to all my colleagues for their hard work and dedication to ensuring our children get the very best education we can provide. We are very lucky to have such commitment from all our teaching team. Equally important is our office team; the systems and processes ensure the school runs smoothly and effectively to support the childrens' learning, Mrs Thompson and Mrs Perkins have done an amazing job this year! Our caretaker, Nuno and his team have done a great job redecorating the classrooms and keeping the school as free from mud as possible! Unfortunately Nuno is currently off work with a rare pulmonary embolism which he is receiving treatment I am sure you will join me in wishing him a speedy recovery—we hope he will be back in the New Year. A huge thank you to our Governors who give up their time voluntarily to support the continued development of our school.

As we look forward to the New Year we are focussing on our own adult learning. Miss Astall and myself have completed the intial stages of Headship and Executive Headship qualifications and have been able to implement new approaches and strategies in school . In January Miss Lobley, Miss Kempton and Mr Waugh will all start their Nationally accredited qualifications in senior leadership (NPQL). Miss Roberts will begin a similarly accredited course in leading teaching with a focus on supporting new teachers and students. It is important that we stay up to date with new thinking and research so that we can continue to improve our provision and approaches to support our children. Our school improvement work next term will focus on Science; Miss Roberts will undertake 2 days specialist training and we will implement this new knowledge into our science curriculum.

Over the holidays we will have a number of building projects taking place. The drains are to be dug up and new pipe work installed . We are also installing 2 "witches cauldrons" in the playground to improve the facilities for the children at playtimes. Have a wonderful Xmas and New Year. Best wishes from us all.

Year 3 & 4 Mindfullness Workshop



In November, we were very pleased to welcome Bethany Lewis from Turn the Page counselling to school to run mindfulness workshops for our Year 3 and 4 children. Bethany is a trained and highly skilled Integrative therapist and works regularly in schools helping children to appreciate how beneficial mindfulness can be. The children were split into groups of 15 and entered the hall to the most wonderful soothing aromatherapy oils to instantly put them at ease. Bethany talked to the children about the importance of mindfulness and helped them practise techniques that they can use in their daily lives. Evie-May commented that the hall smelt lovely and it was very relaxing. Bethany told us that when you are feeling stressed it is very

important to stay calm and she showed us ways we can do that. All the children commended that it was a wonderful experience and that they had definitely benefited from the sessions. Bethany will be back in the New Year to run workshops with our Year 5 & 6 children.
