Message from Mr.B

A special mention to our Year 6 children for the fantastic way they approached their SATs exams; I was so proud of their positive attitude and resilience during a very challenging week. They have worked incredibly hard and were supported by a fantastic team. Well done! Next half term it will be the turn of our Year1 children to take their phonics screening test and Year 4 to take their multiplication tests.

Our school improvement work has centred around assessments in the Foundation subjects and we have used a support tool created by Alex Bedford to categorise and grade each subject; doing this has enabled us to identify the areas we need to improve to enhance the learning for our children. The progress we have made in history and Geography will be assessed by our school improvement partner next half term. We have been selected for Y6 writing moderation by the local authority and Miss Astall will be presenting our childrens' graded work to the moderators at the end of June. Next half term we will be trailing the new phonics scheme (Super Sonic Phonics) in Early Years and KS1; colleagues will work with some children to test the materials and gain confidence in the new scheme and planning. Throughout next half term our Teaching Assistants will be trained and we will be ready to start the whole school approach in September. We will be holding parental workshops next year so you will become aware of the new techniques. We are in the process of purchasing new books to support our existing book binding and this will further stimulate the love of reading so many of our children have. To support our online safety work we will be hosting a session led by Tanya Cross to support with helping your child access the internet, games and Whatsapp safely.

Our building work over the holiday and into next half term will continue to focus on redecoration of school. We are planning to have the staff room and Rainbow room painted and if the weather permits the outside sills all round school. During the term we will hopefully get all the bays painted and by next September we will have completed the whole school. Our office team have worked incredibly hard and we passed our annual Health and Safety Audit with flying colours with only minor recommendations. A fantastic effort by Mrs Perkins and Mrs Thompson. In addition to this they again successfully completed the financial value standard and submitted it to the local authority.

As you will read, the children have lots of opportunities to do some fantastic activities and they are currently preparing for the topics they will cover next half term. Unfortunately a significant number of our children are being disadvantaged due to unauthorised term time holidays. This is a growing concern, especially in Early Years and KS1. There is significant research which clearly states how detrimental this is to children and more alarming is that these holidays are now taken near half term breaks. To date we have lost 237 days to unauthorised holidays-significantly higher than last year. Please support our children by not taking them on term time holidays.



Year 3 Hindu Mandir Visit

Year 3 went to visit a Hindu Mandir and learnt about the common beliefs and practices in the faith. We took a tour around the Temple and were encouraged to ask questions as we looked around. The BAPS Shri Swaminarayan we visited aim to preserve Indian culture and the Hindu ideals of faith, unity, and selfless service in diverse communities around the world. The vast building captivated Year 3 from the moment the bus pulled into the car park.



Year 5 and 6 - Virtual Author Visit - Tanya Landman

This half-term, our Year 5 and 6 children had the exciting opportunity to participate in a virtual author visit with Tanya Landman, the acclaimed author of Midwinter Burning.

During the session, Tanya shared her inspiring journey to becoming a writer, offering the children a glimpse into her creative process and the steps she took to bring Midwinter Burning to life.

Tanya's storytelling captivated the children as she detailed how her ideas evolve from initial concepts to fully developed stories. She explained the research and thought that go into her writing, particularly how she crafted the historical and emotional layers of Midwinter Burning.

The highlight of the visit was the interactive question and answer session. Our children asked insightful questions about the challenges and joys of being an author. Year 6 - A Journey into the Future of Aerospace on 23/04/2024

Year 6 were invited to soar into a world of innovation and creativity with a workshop in conjunction with STEM Learning and the Smallpiece Trust. The day was fuelled with high-flying adventure!
