Message from Mr.B

As you will read we have had an incredibly busy half term and the children have had the opportunity to participate in such a wide range of activities. This year our school has been assessed by every organisation that judges schools performance. We had a Local Authority moderation visit to assess our KS1 practice to go alongside our OFSTED in March. We were accredited with the Eco school award again, this time achieving distinction. The Proud Trust assessed our work and awarded our Rainbow Flag for the second time. We have passed our Health and Safety and Financial Audits with flying colours! I am incredibly proud of all our achievements this year and really grateful to my colleagues, the children and you for the dedication and hard work that goes into these achievements. It's a real Torkington team effort!!

Our school improvement work next term will be to implement the new history, geography and art schemes we have been trialling. We plan to appoint a Governor to work alongside Mr Waugh and Mrs Pietrzak to ensure we cover these subjects in greater depth. We will evaluate out school improvement plan and set the new one in the Autumn term and this will form the basis of our work next year.

We have been busy refurbishing the annex; it has been deep cleaned, painted and a new fence installed ready for the new after school/ day care provider. Our Groundsman is also building bespoke new furniture for EYFS outdoor provision and this will be ready for the children in September. Our caretaker is continuing the decoration programme and years 3 and 4 will be painted over the summer holiday.

Miss Bridge has decided to persue a career outside of teaching and resigned from her position last week. Mrs Pietrzak and Mrs Hollingshead will take the Reception class next year and Mrs Guggiari and Miss Warburton will lead the Year 1 class. I apologise for the short notification but we had little notice. Mrs Owen will also leave us this year to take up a role as a post person. Mrs Owen has worked in school for 17 years as a teaching assistant and specialised in nurturing our children's talent for art and design. Mrs Bennett will also be leaving us to take up her career in teaching at a special school. Mrs Bennett has worked tireless in school to develop pupil voice through the 3 school councils, Eco, Learning and Protected Rights. She has also been responsible for the beautiful displays throughout school. It has been an amazing privilege to have worked with such outstanding colleagues and I wish them all the very best for their futures. Finally, a huge well done and good luck to our Y6 children as they move on to their new adventures. They have been amazing! Have a great holiday.
