Message from Mr.B

As we draw to a close I think it is worth reflecting on a fantastic year for our children. We received a letter from the Minister for Education for being in the top 1% of schools nationally and were in the MEN for being in the top 10 for schools across all of Greater Manchester-these accolades reflect the hard work and dedication of our teaching teams and the special relationship they have with the children they support. I am so proud of all their hard work. Our office team are brilliant; Mrs Thompson and Mrs Perkins have faced major challenges this year and completed them with efficiency and professionalism. The financial audits, Health and Safety inspection outcomes reflect that our school is effectively run and managed. Our Groundsman, Ian Marshal and our caretaking team, Nuno and Diogo have ensured that our learning environment in and out of school is of the highest standard. Our new cook Emma and her assistant Kirsty have improved the school lunch provision and we are really pleased with the start the new team have made. Our Governors are all volunteers who work really hard to support our school and ensure we continue to provide the best education for our children. These colleagues that work behind the scenes are vital for the efficient running of our school and I am really grateful for the care and attention they show every day to support our children.

Much of our school improvement has been developing the foundation subjects and how and what we are teaching and how we assess progress. The local Authority has moderated this work and we will continue to build on this for next year. Our work has been influenced by the Alex Bedford approach and next term we will be developing key vocabulary linked to each subject in each year group to ensure knowledge is built on sequentially. Next year we will roll out our new phonics scheme—Super sonic phonics will be taught in Early years and Key Stage 1 and we will hold parent workshops for you early next term. A key focus for our school improvement will be Science and Design and Technology—a particular focus will be on experimentation and prediction.

Our building work will continue over the summer with the sills and main gate being painted. Their will be a total deep clean of school, including the kitchen by a specialist cleaning team. New shelving equipment is on order and will be ready for September. Through the fantastic efforts of the office team and the PTA we have purchased an 8 station outdoor multi gym which will be placed behind the existing trim trail. We have submitted plans for the 4G pitch and we are incredibly grateful to Mr Allen for his work pulling this proposal together.

This year we have a number of families leaving school, many of whom I have worked with almost all my time here. I am so grateful for the trust and support they have shown the school and wish our superb Year 6 children all the very best for their next steps in high school. Have a great summer .

1st Aid Training for Year 5 and 6

This half-term, our Year 5 and 6 pupils had the invaluable opportunity to receive first aid training from Millie's Trust. The sessions were highly educational and equipped the children with essential life-saving skills.

During the training, the pupils learned how to put someone in need into the recovery position and the correct way to contact emergency services while communicating clearly and effectively. They also practiced conducting CPR on a practice dummy, gaining confidence in performing this crucial technique. Additionally, the children had a hands-on experience using a defibrillator, understanding its importance, functionality and location in the school. "Learning how to do CPR was really interesting. Year 3 & 4 Martin Mere Trip

Year 3 and 4 visited Martin Mere this half term to put their scientific classifying skills into practice. First we went pond dipping in purpose-built raised ponds. Then using the specialist equipment, including electronic microscope and screen, we classified and identified the different pond animals. Next, we explored the causes of climate change and the impact this is having on wetlands. By taking on the role of a leaf we discovered how plants have an important role to play in absorbing carbon dioxide. At the end of our trip we were climate champions campaigning for change!
